Students move through different stages of job training during their course of study at Philips Academy. While we incorporate job training into everyday school life, Workday Wednesdays are very important.

Most older students complete the online Next Up curriculum and receive a certificate. Next Up is a guide to create resumés, prepare for interviews, learn about common workplace scenarios, and fill out paperwork that promotes competitive employment now and in the future. Hiring individuals with

intellectual and developmental disabilities is more than just the right thing to do, it's good for business!


Philip Blount, our very own World Games Special Olympian will compete in track & field in Berlin this summer!
